We just submitted our final report and will wait to hear if our efforts still qualify! All told, we estimate we invested around 600 hours to pull it off! Thanks to everyone involved.

Thank you to **Carolyn Stillwell, Susan LaBuda, Chris Mazglad, Stephanie Rose** and **Karla Cloninger,** who helped create and wrap the beautiful baskets for our raffle for our **student scholarship** fund. Those baskets wouldn't have been made possible without the generous donations from our members and local businesses. Thank you! We raised **\$958.00** from the sale of raffle tickets.

We also had our inaugural **online auction** to help raise money for our student scholarship that was created by **Eric Courtney** and **Chris Mazglad**. So many cool things were listed that people in the community could bid on and potentially win. I was certainly happy with my winnings! It was easy to bid on items, and you were notified when you were outbid too! Our online auction raised **\$1,775 towards our student scholarship**! Our past president **Stephanie Rose** organized the pop up artists on Army Street and also hosted our kids art activity tent. They painted rocks and made beaded bracelets. She was very busy both days and managed to run her tent and check on all the other participants. Thank you Stephanie, for your continued support of our gallery. I could tell by the smiles that it was worth the while, and we raised **\$419** from this event.

Then there were the grids that needed to be set up and taken down. The artists helped each other put up the grids and we had a little extra help with clean-up thanks to our artist's significant others and children! But the most amazing part was that every member just chipped in and did what was necessary to make this a great two days for City Lights Art **Gallery.** I have to add, **Susan** is an expert at gallery floor cleaning, and I can't thank her enough for that! Our gallery had heavy traffic both days, and we sold \$1,993 in sales and added fourteen new members to our gallery. A special thanks to **Carolyn Stillwell** who ran the extremely busy gallery both days, fantastic job well done! Thank you to Lola Meneses who helped out on Saturday inside the gallery and **Dotty Fenner** who helped out inside the gallery on Sunday. Your work allowed other artists to be outside. You were the faces that people in the community met and identified our gallery with, and you just made everyone feel so welcome. Thank you!

Overall, we had a gross income of \$6,608 and after artists commissions on gallery sales and expenses related to the event, our treasurer **Sujata Kishor** says we netted **\$4,279**. part of the **Art Festival of Henderson** and a spectacular two days!






Our May Member Meeting's
